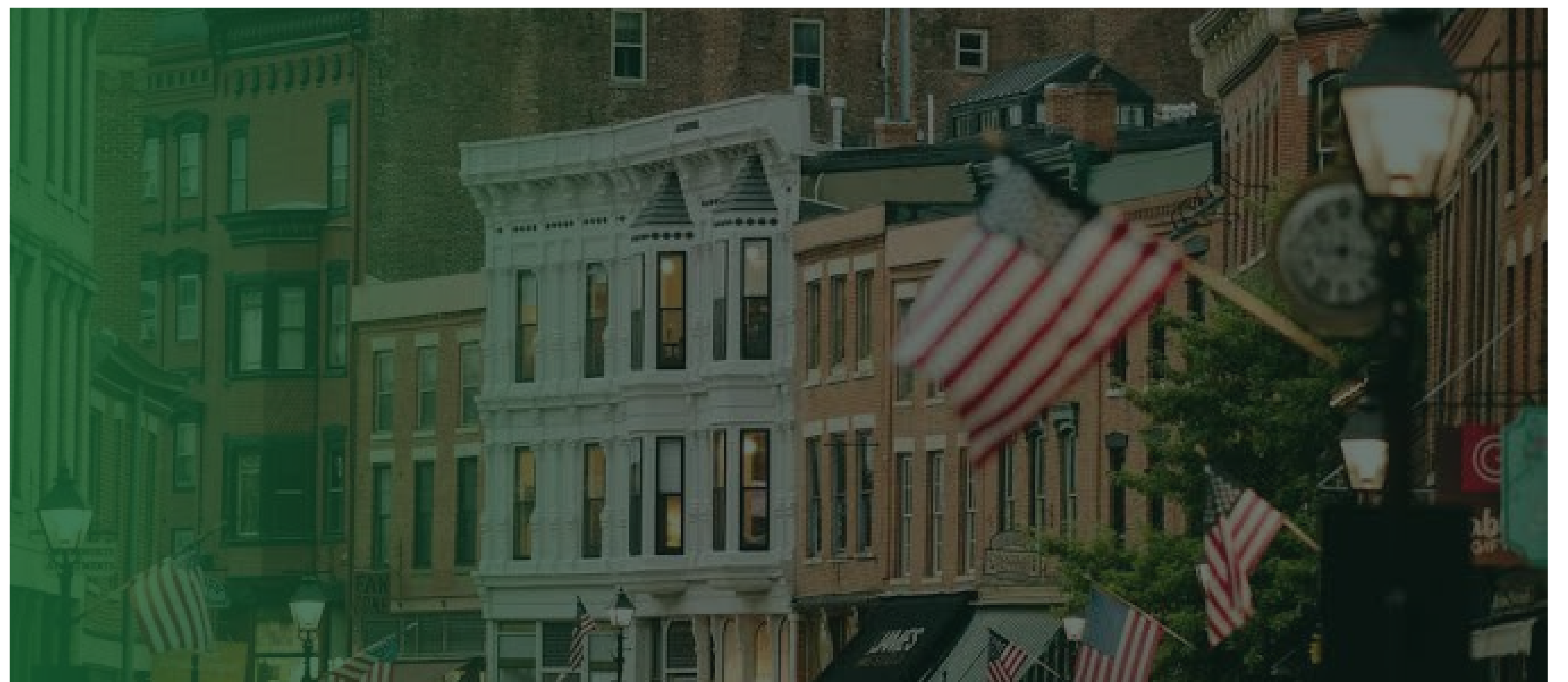

The challenge

A growing business in the Midwest had old computers, batteries, and light bulbs piling up in storage, along with boxes of documents that needed to be destroyed. The team didn't have an easy way to dispose of it safely, and they had no paperwork to show it had been handled properly if anyone ever asked.

The background

Recycle Technologies has been recycling and shredding for businesses since 1993, out of licensed facilities in Minnesota and Wisconsin. The company is R2v3-certified, meaning its electronics recycling meets strict environmental and safety standards, and it is the only minority-owned document destruction and recycling company in the Midwest.

The client needed someone who could take everything at once: old laptops and monitors, dead batteries, spent bulbs, and confidential paper files, and prove it had all been disposed of properly. Recycle Technologies picked up the electronics and batteries directly from the client's site, shredded the paper on-site, and destroyed the hard drives to prevent data recovery. Once the pickup was completed, the client received a recycling certificate for their records, providing proof of compliant, responsible disposal without having to track it down themselves. "It's a relief to hand this off to people who know exactly how to deal with it safely," said the client's operations manager. "We used to worry about where all this stuff ended up. Now we just call and it's taken care of."
